LOTTERY FUNDED

£10,000 Awarded!

Fantastic news that our bid submitted just before Christmas to the National Lottery has been granted. We have £10,000 to

spend on making improvements to our Early Years outdoor area.

What have Primary been up to?

In Early Years this half term, the pupils have been learning all about plants and growing. They have planted cress seeds, cucumber plants, daffodils and ivy. The children take turns to water the seeds and have enjoyed watching them grow. We are currently building a garden centre role play in our outdoor area and we would be grateful for donations of gardening equipment, please small trowels, watering cans, plants......

Kimberley's class have thoroughly enjoyed Science this half term! As part of Science week we worked outside looking at how different objects move, if we can speed them up, slow them down, timing their speed and sorting them appropriately. The children worked very hard throughout this and as a reward we are having an end of term Easter egg hunt and egg rolling competition! We look forward to seeing who can make their egg roll the quickest.

In Amy's the topic has been transport. The pupils have enjoyed role-playing road safety outside in the yard using the road and zebra crossing. They all took turns being the lollypop person, pedestrians and car drivers, practicing their stop, look and listen. They looked the part in their high visibility jackets!

In Joe's class this half term the pupils have been looking at changing materials in Science. They have completed lots of experiments focusing on the processes of changing materials. The most popular experiments were making non-Newtonian liquid (corn flour slime) and putting coke in Mentos!

In maths they have been looking at fractions in both shape and number, using this as an excuse to make pizzas, both the paper Mache type and the edible type! The end results were brilliant and are proudly displayed outside their classroom.



Debbie & Diane's class topic has been 'Stones and Bones'. The children have learnt about features of rocks, including making volcanoes and geysers. They loved it and had great success. They have also studied Dinosaurs, learning some of their long names

and looking at their features. In Maths, they have been comparing sizes, tallying and comparing amounts. The children really enjoy their Read, Write, Inc. sessions and in ICT they have been investigating new and old technology e.g. cassette recorders!

In Cara's class they have been looking at the rainforest and the different animals that live there. The children used laptops to find images and made a fact file booklet. They tried different fruits such as coconuts and avocados, even making snakes that they could eat! They have worked together to create a display in the classroom and labelled the four different layers of the rainforest.

Lucy's class have become the Wizard and Witches Academy practicing making spells and potions!







In holistic maths they have been looking at

numbers to 10 through rhymes and songs. The children have been encouraged to count 1:1 using Numicon and counting bears along with exchanging pennies with current buns.



They have been reading the sensory story Dragon's Lair. The children have been exploring the dark cave and finding the buried treasure before the dragon wakes up.

Secondary Department Update



March 10th to 19th was National Science and Engineering Week.

All classes took part in 2 activities looking at irreversible reactions.

Firstly, they made their own lava lamps!! They added water, food colouring and oil to a water bottle, then added Alka-seltzer. The contents began to fizz turning the bottle into a lava lamp!! The pupils learnt about the bubbles from the dissolving Alka-Seltzer rising up through the oil and taking a little water with them and the coloured water falling again once the bubbles burst.

In the second activity they added Mentos mints to Diet Coke Cola to make a fizzy fountain!! Always a favourite!

We are following the STA Rockhopper Swimming Programme that is a national swimming initiative for people with disabilities and we hope to be awarding badges and certificates to pupils for their achievements later in the academic year.

In PE sessions all students have concentrated on Gymnastic skills. They have worked on partner balances, individual balances, focussing on agility, balance and co-ordination. Students have progressed to vaulting through objects with varying heights to floor work. Well done everyone!



In art and craft this half term, the children have been making lots of different Easter treats. They have made cards, decorated hats, made masks and painted eggs.

They have listened to various music while they explore, experiment and create their art.

In cookery club, the pupils have made pancakes with various toppings, St Patrick fairy cakes, mouse themed baked potatoes and Rocky Road biscuits. They have worked well together, allocating specific roles with impressive outcomes.

In Sports Club, the children have supported each other whilst working on gymnastics skills, a combination of rolls, jumps and balances. This has been achieved through the use of single, partner and group balances.
