School Choir takes to the Stage

The choir is growing in size and confidence as they start to chalk up their public performances! They have performed in front of Mayor at school and also at Christ Church in North Shields as part of the LD:NE carol service on 2nd December. They got the loudest cheer after they sang and signed 'Rocking around the Christmas tree'. Well done Nichola for her reading. Next date for the diary is 20th March at The Playhouse in Whitley Bay.

What have Primary been up to?

Cara's class have been looking at the human body in Science focussing on the digestive system. The children have had great fun making a model! In art they have been practicing self-portraits using different methods and material, whilst looking at the work of Pablo Picasso.

Kimberley's class have been exploring a range of Julia Donaldson books this half term, working very hard on sentences and identifying key features of the books. The children have also been expanding their communication skills using the game 'Guess Who', which they made with their class photos. However, they are most excited about their Christmas treat which they have been working hard for. They are cooking Christmas cakes and biscuits then eating them whilst watching a Christmas movie to finish the half term!

Keely's class have been enjoying reading Mr Stink by David Walliams, in their English sessions. They have used the book to complete work on punctuating speech, writing character profiles, writing back stories for characters, making predictions and completing a book review. The whole class have thoroughly enjoyed the book and thought that it was very funny. They enjoyed watching the DVD of the book as a special treat to end the unit of work.

Ahoy there, Matey! In Amy's class this half term they have been learning all about pirates, including reading lots of pirate stories, with The Pirates Next Door and The Night Pirates being the favourites! The children threw a pirate party for Jim Lad, one of the pirates from the story, and made invitations for Cara's class to come along. They had such fun and loved the pirate hats and eye-patches!

Diane and Debbie's class have been working on the Great Fire of London. The children have created time lines of events, acting out roles of characters, creating diaries of events and comparing the fire service in the present day to in 1666, as well as looking at sensory aspects. Ask any of the children in the class and they should tell you that the Great Fire of London started in 1666 in Thomas Farriner's bakers shop on Pudding Lane. Quiz them about how the fire was put out and where the water was collected from and prepare to be amazed!

Physical Education

The swimming sessions at school are progressing really well. The pupils are showing fantastic progression by developing water confidence skills, swimming strokes and techniques. Some of our pupils are swimming independently and some enjoy hydrotherapy sessions where they are supported on a 1:1 basis. Relaxation music is played whilst they do gentle stretches in the water.

This term the children have been making festive treats such as cards, decorations and wrapping paper. They have enjoyed listening to music as they work. The children have had some lovely individual ideas that they have been able to share with their friends.
